NGS Navajo Scholarship Information

Who may apply for an SRP/NGS Navajo Scholarship? To be eligible, the applicant must be:

- ___ an enrolled member of the Navajo Nation;
- ___ a full-time student at an accredited college or university;
- ___ a junior in college/university to apply; and
- ___ have a minimum overall GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.

Priority is given to the math, engineering and environmental studies.

What is the value of this scholarship? Award amounts are determined by the NGS Scholarship Committee following an evaluation of the financial need analysis of each applicant. The undergraduate scholarships are renewable until the bachelor's degree is earned. There is no funding available for graduate students.

How are the selections made? The NGS Scholarship Committee reviews all applications. Awards are made based on the field of study, academic excellence, and achievement. Candidates are notified by e-mail. All decisions of the NGS Scholarship Committee are final.

How are the funds administered? The NGS Scholarship Committee administers the funds. A check is mailed each semester to the scholarship office of the college/university to be credited to the recipient's account. Subsequent checks are mailed following a review of the transcript and GPA. The recipient is required to order an official transcript to be sent to the NGS Scholarship Committee at the close of the semester.

How does a person apply for an SRP Navajo Generating Station Navajo Scholarship? Candidates must submit the following documents as the application packet:

1. ___ A completed 2012-2013 Navajo Generating Station Navajo Scholarship Application.
2. ___ A one-page letter addressed to the Scholarship Committee explaining career goals, reasons for selecting the field of study, and why the student believes SRP/NGS should provide funds.
3. ___ A current resume, which is to include schools attended and employment.
4. ___ Current and official transcripts. *Copies or information off the Internet are not acceptable.*
5. Two letters of recommendation:
 - ___ one from an instructor familiar with the student's academic abilities; and
 - ___ one from a college/university advisor or counselor.
6. ___ A document or letter from the financial aid office of the school, to support the amount requested.
7. ___ Certificate of Indian Blood, which verifies the applicant's enrollment with the Navajo Tribe.

What is the application deadline? The application period is from **January 1, 2012 to June 5, 2012**. Only the complete application packets received by or post marked **June 5, 2012**, will be accepted. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered. Send application packet to:
