# “As a family, make your home water safe!”

Thank you for pledging to make your home water safe. This water safety inspection is meant to be a family activity, takes only 20 minutes to complete and should be re-inspected periodically. It’s an easy way to save lives through discovering possible drowning hazards and discussing water safety with your children!

**Directions:** Check each item on the list as you inspect it and correct issues as needed. Dewey thanks you!

GENERAL	YES	NO
Adults and caregivers know CPR.		
Children are never left alone near any kind of water.		
Everyone in the family has taken swimming lessons so we’re safer in the water.		
Everyone knows the emergency phone number 9-1-1.		

INSIDE	YES	NO
Adults never leave children alone in the tub. They get towels and clothes ready before starting the bath.		
There are locks on the doors of the house that only adults can reach.		
An alarm beeps if doors to the pool are open.		
Windows and pet doors have locks on them to keep children from getting outside.		
A lock keeps the toilet seat closed to keep babies and toddlers safe.		
Buckets are emptied after they are used.		

OUTSIDE	YES	NO
Children swim only if an adult is there to supervise them.		
There is a fence and latching gate around the pool.		
The yard and pool are enclosed with a self-closing, self-locking fence with vertical bars.		
No one swims alone.		
There is a protective cover on the pool.		
There is a cover over the hot tub.		
Play pools are emptied.		
There is a phone near the pool.		
There is a life ring, a rope or a shepherd’s hook near the pool.		
All toys are removed from the pool area.
