

SAFETY MINUTE: MYLAR BALLOONS

Balloons caught in power lines can cause outages, fire, property damage, or injury.

Safety tips:

- Keep tethered at all times, attached to a weight, do not release them
- Use regular string or ribbon, not Mylar string
- Remove all helium before disposal
- Never try to retrieve a balloon from power equipment, keep at least 10 feet away



- Regulatory stability

Recent SRP matters before the ACC

- SRP request for bonding authorization approved
- Coolidge Expansion Project
- Certificate of Environmental Compatibility (CEC) granted for Project Huckleberry
- Palo Verde to Pinal West CEC Extension approved for 10 years (thru 2034)

Line Siting Efficiency Efforts

- Governor Hobbs signed H.B. 2496 into law to narrow the definition of a transmission line, aiming to exclude short gen-ties from line siting statutes
- Currently a 24-month backlog to process CEC applications
- AG Mayes appointed new line siting chair Adam Stafford
- Committee appointed chair to act as a hearing officer to process applications administratively

FERC Commissioners

- FERC Commissioners are nominated by the President, and then Confirmed by the Senate.
- Chair is the administrative head of the agency.
- Can never have more than 3 representatives from one party.







Expanded Market Footprints








