The Facilities and Support Services (F&SS) Committee of the Salt River Project Agricultural Improvement and Power District (the District) and the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association (the Association), collectively SRP, convened at 11:35 a.m. on Tuesday, June 24, 2025, from the Board Room at the SRP Administration Building, 1500 North Mill Avenue, Tempe, Arizona. This meeting was conducted in-person and via teleconference in compliance with open meeting law guidelines.

Review of District and Association Damage Claims for the  
Period of February 1, 2025 through April 30, 2025

Using a PowerPoint presentation, Jason D. Hovis, SRP Senior Manager of Claims Services, reviewed the damage claims against the District and Association paid during the period of February 1, 2025 through April 30, 2025. They provided details of a vehicular accident that occurred on January 4, 2017, involving claimant, Jacob Laurence.

J.D. Hovis stated that an SRP employee was driving southbound on 83rd Avenue in the right-through lane intending to continue south across Lower Buckeye Road. They provided an overview of the incident, stating that the SRP vehicle struck the Plaintiff's vehicle, the SRP driver was cited for an unsafe lane change, and the Plaintiff and his minor son sought medical evaluation soon after the collision.

J.D. Hovis provided an ariel view of the vehicles' position southbound on 83rd Avenue leading up to the point of collision. They also provided images of both the SRP vehicle and the Plaintiff's vehicle post collision. J.D. Hovis said that on January 24, 2025, the parties mediated resolution of the remaining claims; SRP negotiated dismissal of all remaining claims and resolved the case for \$500,000; and the case was dismissed with prejudice.

J.D. Hovis responded to questions from the Committee.

Copies of the District and Association Damage Claims reports for the period of February 1, 2025, through April 30, 2025, and the PowerPoint slides used in this presentation, are on file in the Corporate Secretary's Office and, by reference, made a part of these minutes.

S.M. Glover and K.L. Morrison of SRP left the meeting during the presentation.

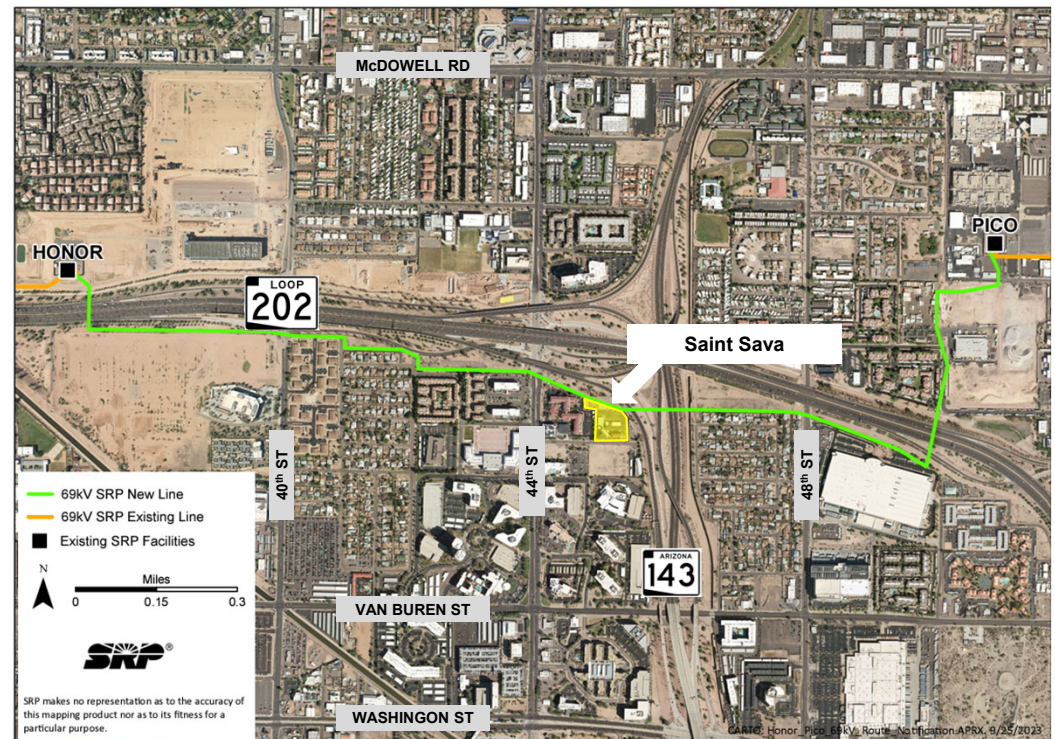

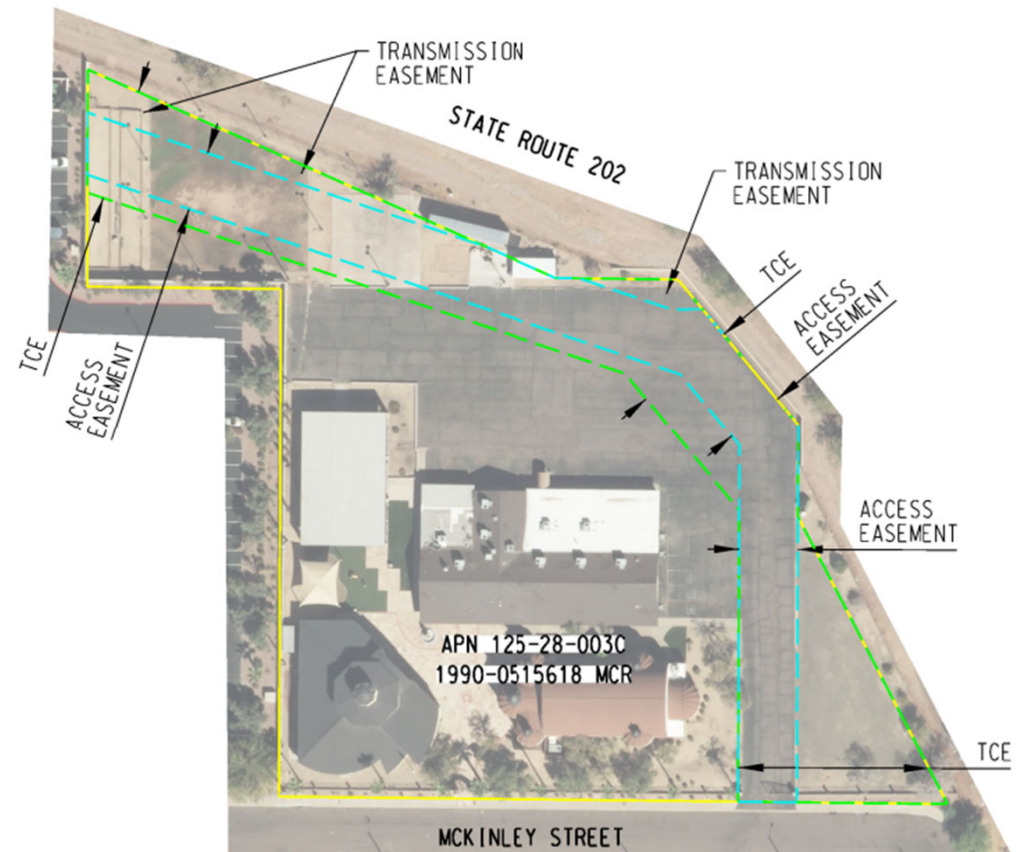
# BACKGROUND – HONOR-PICO BACKGROUND

- New 69kV Transmission Line  
Connecting the Honor and Pico Substations
- Located in Phoenix, Near the Loop 202 (North / Red Mountain)
- Between 36th St & 52nd St
- Board authorized condemnation on January 6, 2025
- Subject Property: Saint Sava  
Serbian Orthodox Church



## BACKGROUND – CONDEMNATION ACTION

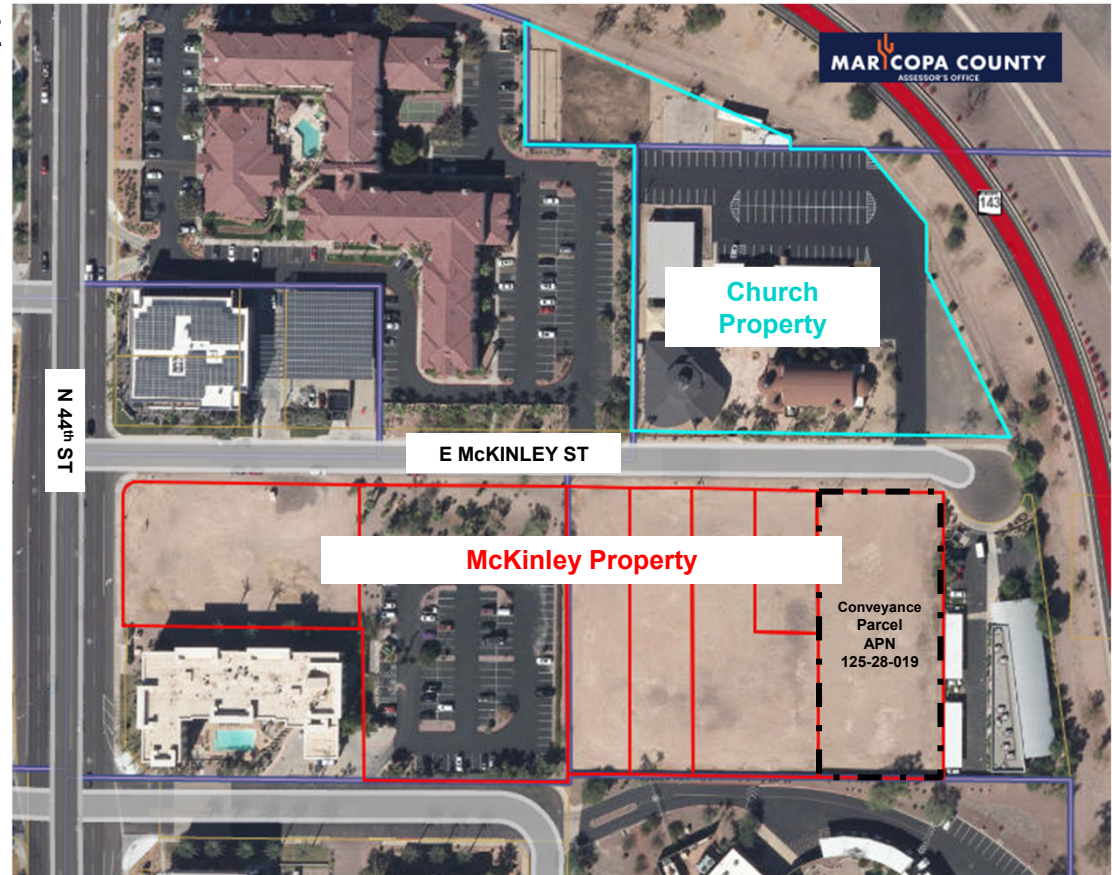
- On May 2, 2025, SRP filed a condemnation action against the Saint Sava Serbian Orthodox Church to acquire easements for transmission, access, and temporary construction
- SRP negotiated a settlement after multiple meetings with the Church and its representatives





# TRANSACTION TERMS

- SRP executed a purchase agreement for the 5.16-acre McKinley Property directly south of Church
- Church stipulated to Order of Immediate Possession.
- SRP to convey of 0.91-acre parcel to Church as compensation for easements
- Parties to stipulate to Judgment and Final Order of Condemnation

# Quarterly Claims-Paid Reporting Proposed Modified Resolution

## Quarterly Claims Reporting

- All claims paid are currently, and will continue to be, reported on a quarterly basis, regardless of amount.
- In 2017, the threshold for detailed reporting for claims paid increased from \$2000 to \$7500 by Board Resolution.
- The threshold for detailed reporting has not been adjusted since 2017 and historically high rates of inflation have occurred since that time.

## Proposed Resolution Modifications

- **Increase the threshold triggering detailed reporting of claims paid from \$7,500 to \$25,000**
  - Consistent with increased inflation and costs associated with vehicular accidents and damage to equipment and home appliances.
  - Maintains full visibility as to all claims paid with detailed reporting remaining in alignment with the Board and Management's interest in significant exposures.
- **Update outdated titles**
- **Clarify delegated settlement authority**

## Recommendation

Management recommends the September 11, 2017 Board Resolution concerning the payment and prosecution of claims be rescinded and replaced with a new resolution that raises the threshold for detailed reporting on claims to \$25,000, updates title names and clarifies delegated settlement authority.

## Details of Incident

**Description of Incident:**

An SRP employee, occupying the left exit lane, was exiting from westbound 202 Red Mountain Freeway at N. Scottsdale Road, intending to merge into the right exit lane. While checking mirrors for a clear path to merge, traffic ahead had come to a stop. The SRP employee was unable to stop before colliding with the left rear side of Claimant's vehicle while merging into the righthand exit lane. The SRP employee was cited under A.R.S. § 28-701A for failure to control the speed of the vehicle to avoid a collision.

**Summary:**

Claims Services received an estimate for Claimant's vehicle reporting \$36,611.66 in damages, exceeding its estimated value, and deeming it a total loss. Claims Services then obtained a market valuation report for the 2016 Tesla, reporting an actual cash value of \$20,914.11, which was found to be reasonable. Claimant also presented a rental car invoice totaling \$1,421.43 for 10 days of rental car use and was paid \$1,000.00 for minor bodily injury. The total cost to resolve this claim was \$23,335.54.

Total cost paid for this incident was \$24,335.54, including the following related claim brought by the passenger of Claimant's vehicle:
