2024 All-Source Request for Proposals (RFP) Update

Using a PowerPoint presentation, Will Fielder, SRP Resource Acquisition Lead, stated that the purpose of the presentation was to provide information regarding projects selected from the 2024 All-Source RFP.

W. Fielder provided an overview of the remaining capacity needs for Fiscal Plan 2027 (FP27). They provided an overview of the recommended Eagle Eye project and highlighted the benefits of the project.

W. Fielder presented a map showing the vicinity of the Eagle Eye project. They concluded that Eagle Eye is a near-term resource that supports capacity needs and contributes to SRP's 2035 sustainability goals.

W. Fielder responded to questions from the Committee.

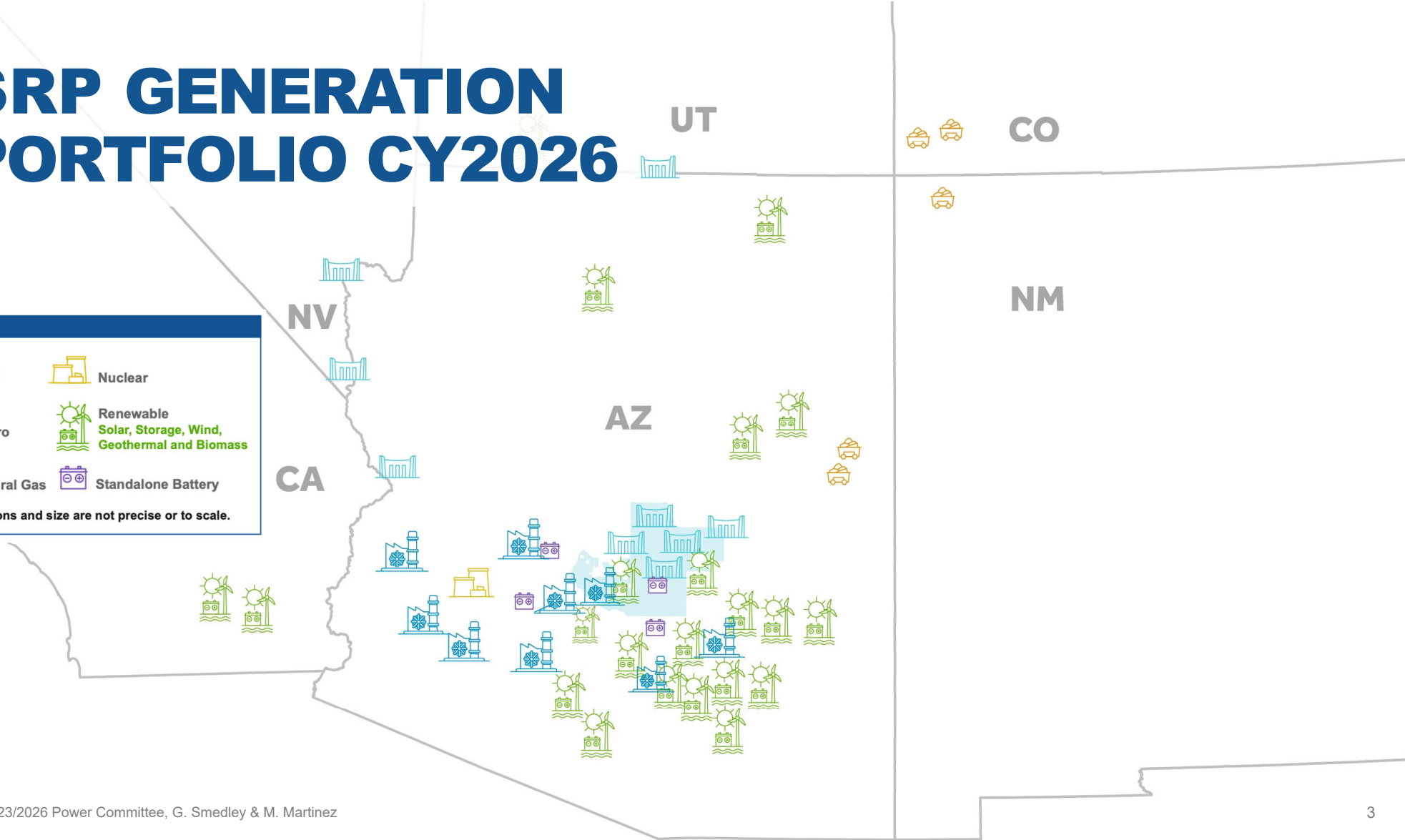

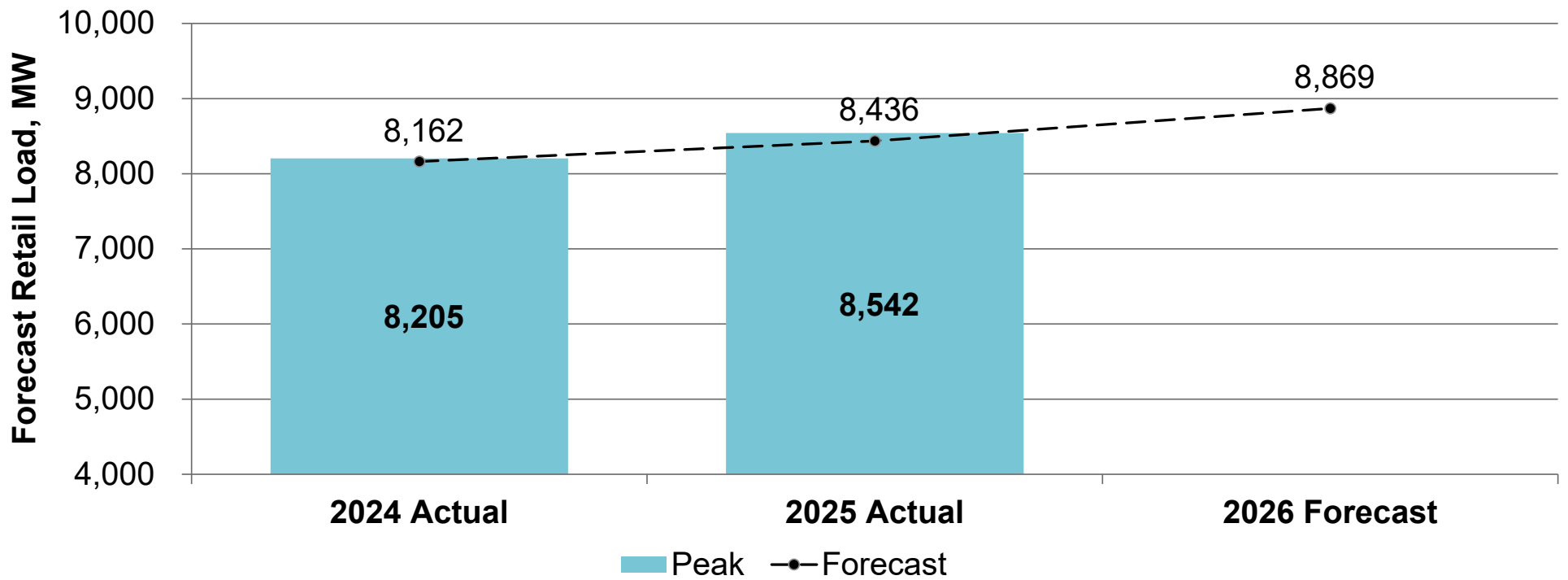

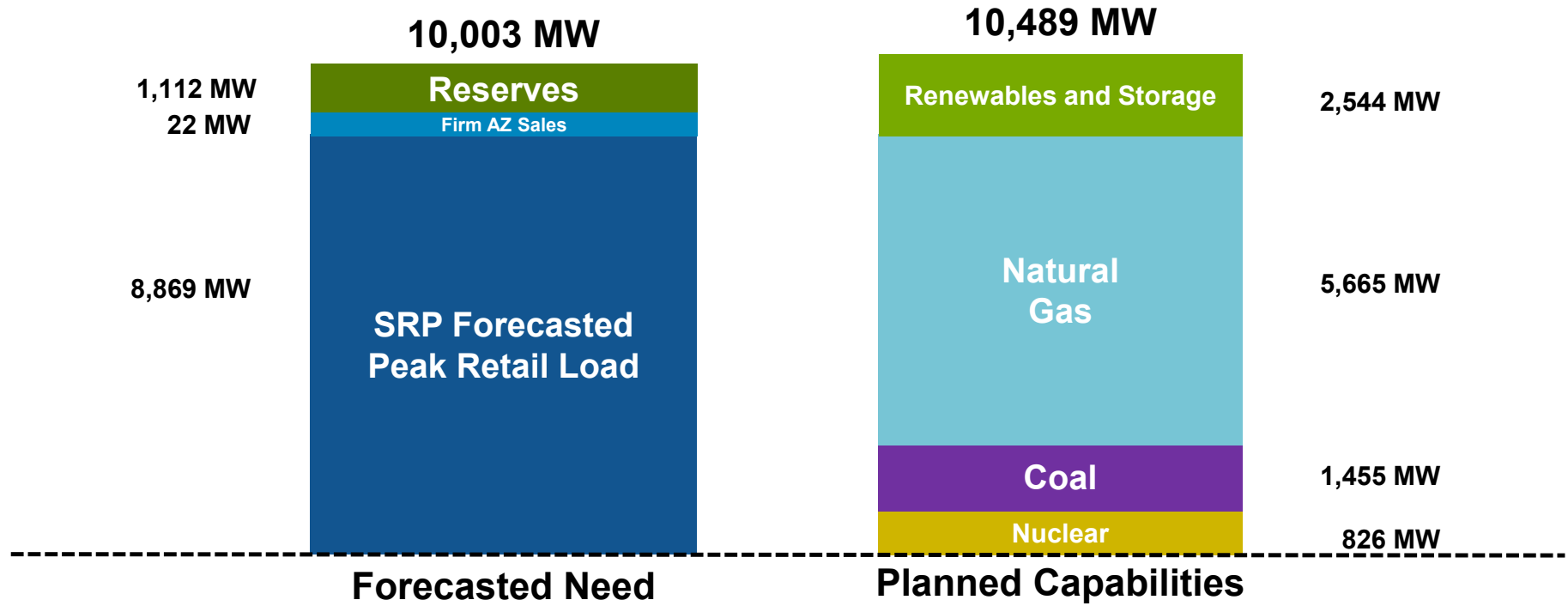

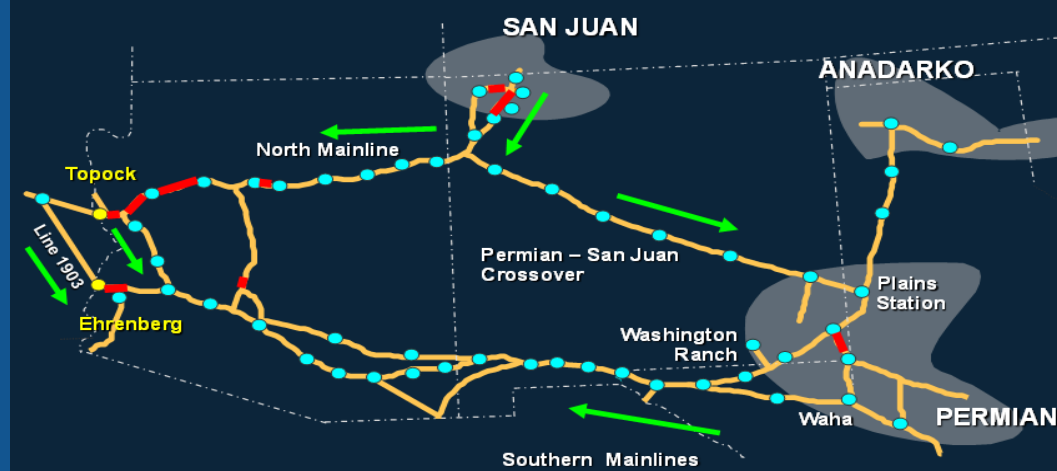

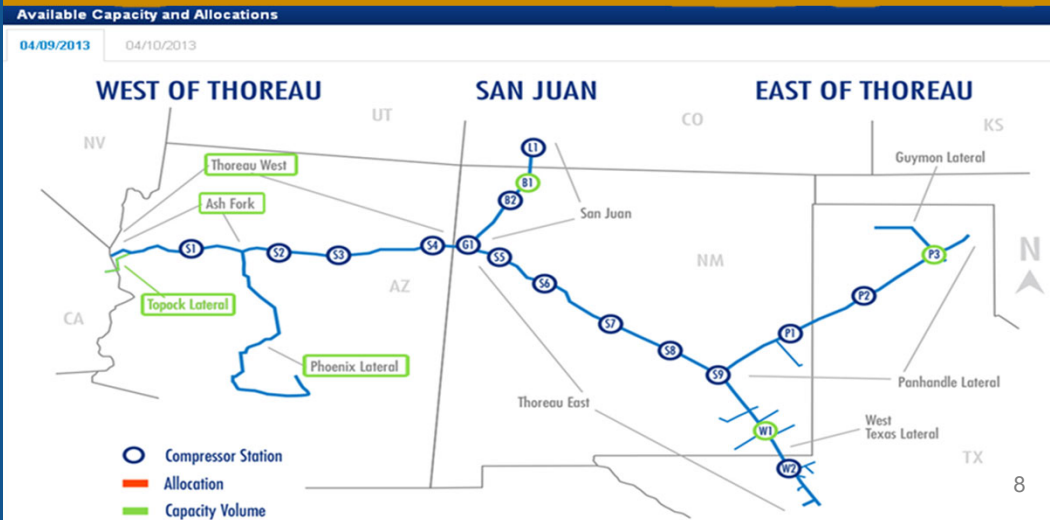

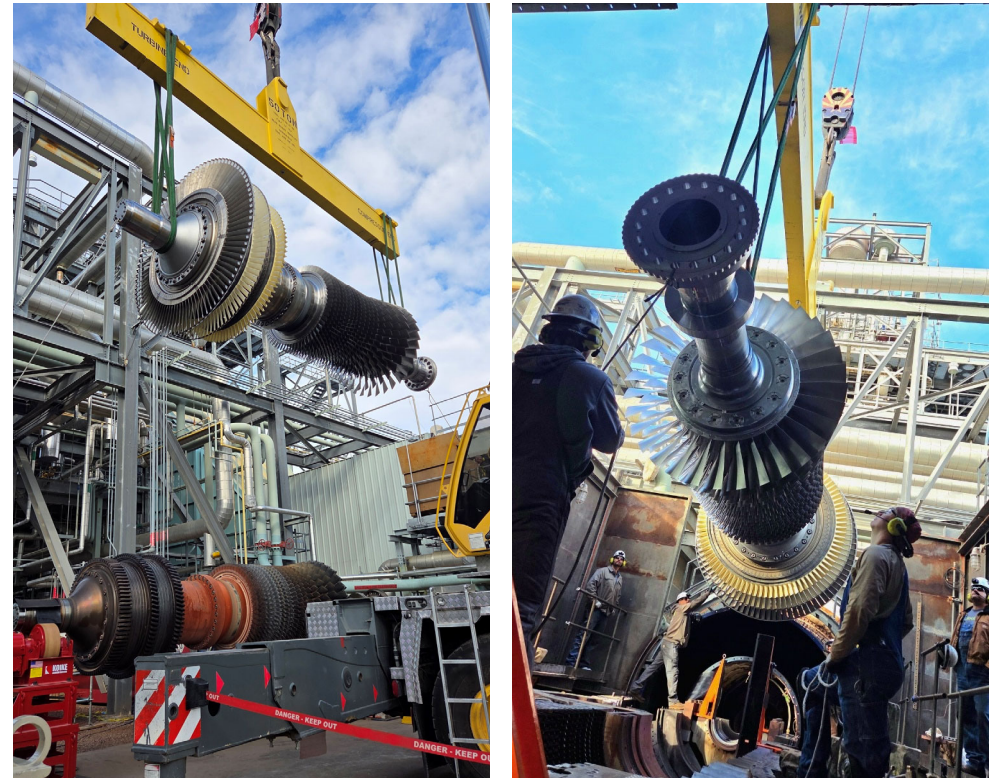
