# Water pricing

On March 27, the Board of Governors of the Salt River Valley Water Users’ Association approved a new schedule of water charges, which will be effective during the 2026 calendar year. SRP’s history dates back to 1903, nearly a decade before Arizona became a state. 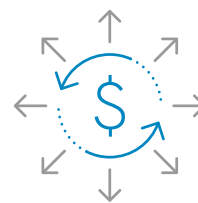
## Irrigation term: Watershed

A watershed is an area of land where rainwater and melted snow drain to the same location. Three watersheds feed the Salt and Verde rivers, which flow into SRP-managed reservoirs.
