On March 27, the Board of Governors of the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association approved a new schedule of water charges, which will be effective during the 2026 calendar year. 



Local ranchers and farmers pledged their own land to help build the Theodore Roosevelt Dam, which was crucial for controlling the Salt River's waters and supporting the region's growth. Today, SRP provides reliable, affordable and sustainable water and energy to over 2 million people in central Arizona.

Summer irrigation schedules are here

Starting April 1, the summer schedule begins. Water will be available in your neighborhood approximately every 14 days from April through September. During the winter months (October through March), the schedule will change to every 28 days, except during the annual canal maintenance

period when water deliveries are not scheduled. To prepare, review your upcoming schedule and wate
