Water Pricing

On March 28, the Board of Governors of the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association approved a new schedule of water charges, which will be effective during the 2024 calendar year.

SRP Reservoirs at 88%

As of March 10, 2023, the SRP reservoir system was **88%** full at **2,010,820** acre-feet in storage. A year ago, the total system was **72%** full. Storage on the Salt River system is at **89%**; the two reservoirs on the Verde River are at a combined **81%** of capacity. Stay up to date on reservoir levels daily at watershedconnection.com.

Understanding Roles and Responsibilities

Roles and responsibilities of irrigation customers and SRP are important components in ensuring we conserve as much water as we can by managing this resource wisely. SRP installs, operates and maintains water delivery systems that are composed of canals, laterals and gates to deliver water to your neighborhood delivery point. Irrigation customers and their neighbors are responsible for installing, operating and maintaining the private neighborhood irrigation system which begins where the SRP-managed structures end. Understanding roles and

responsibilities helps us work together to preserve water in the Valley. Be sure to only order the amount of water that is needed to efficiently meet the needs of your landscape and that can be contained on your property.
