Water pricing

On March 27, the Board of Governors of the Salt River Valley Water Users' Association approved a new schedule of water charges, which will be effective during the 2026 calendar year. Efficient water use is crucial, especially in the Arizona desert. This guide helps you save water while keeping your plants healthy. Over half of the water used at home goes to outdoor watering, so it's essential to water efficiently. Use our interactive guide to determine the right amount of water for your plants and lawn. Remember to water early in the morning or late in the evening to minimize evaporation. By following these tips, you can conserve water and maintain a beautiful landscape all year-round.

Summer irrigation schedules are here

Starting April 1, the summer schedule begins. Water will be available in your neighborhood approximately every 14 days from April through September. During the winter months (October through March), the schedule will change to every 28 days, except during the annual canal maintenance

period when water deliveries are not scheduled. To prepare, review your upcoming schedule and water orders through the SRP Water app™, available for download at srp.net/waterapp.
