CERTIFICATE OF ENVIRONMENTAL COMPATIBILITY

Pursuant to notice given as provided by law, the Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting Committee (the "Committee") held a public hearing at the Colonnade Room in the Ramada Inn, 3801 East Van Buren, Phoenix, Arizona on November 8, 9 and 19, 1984 in conformance with the requirements of Arizona Revised Statutes \$40-360, et seq., for the purpose of receiving evidence and deliberating on the application of the Salt River Project Agricultural Improvement and Power District ("Applicant") for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility in the above captioned case.

The following members and designees of members of the Committee, constituting a majority thereof, were present at the hearing, had an opportunity to review the transcript of that portion of the hearing conducted on November 8 and 9, 1984, participated in the discussion and voted at the conclusion of the hearing on November 19, 1984:

The Applicant was represented by Gregory T. Whalen and Richard H. Silverman of Salt River Project and Jack E. McCall of the law firm of Jennings, Strouss and Salmon.

The following municipalities, organizations and individuals filed timely notices of intent to be a party:

The City of Scottsdale was represented by Joe P. Sparks of the law firm of Sparks and Siler, P.C.

Marilyn K. Armstrong, concerned citizen on behalf of the Tonalea
Homeowners Association

Virginia Harris, concerned citizen on her own behalf.

As a result of agreements reached at prehearing conferences on November 2 and 6, 1984, the Applicant withdrew its objection to the intervention of Ms. Armstrong and Ms. Harris if each were granted limited appearance status at the hearing. A motion recognizing Marilyn Armstrong and Virginia Harris as limited parties to the hearing with opportunity to make oral statement was made, seconded and approved by the Committee.

Prior to this hearing, the Arizona Corporation Commission expressed interest in accommodating public comment at the hearing. The Arizona Attorney General's office was of the opinion that the Corporation Commission cannot order such a public comment period without adopting an appropriate rule or procedure; however, Ms. Abate ruled that public comment was a matter within the Committee's discretion. A motion to allow public comment in this Case No. 69 was proposed by the Chairperson and was approved by the Committee.

Ms. Abate advised the Committee she had denied a Motion in Limine filed by the Applicant, and distributed a copy of her written order, seeking to limit introduction and consideration by the Committee on the issue of need. Ms. Abate overruled objection by the Applicant to the introduction of testimony and evidence concerning need. Ms. Abate, at the conclusion of the hearing, denied a motion made by the Applicant proposing instructions to the Committee as to its duty in considering need. Instructions on burden of proof were read to the Committee by the Chairperson.

At the conclusion of the hearing, the Committee having considered the application, the evidence, testimony and exhibits presented by the Applicant and the Intervenor, the statements of Ms. Armstrong and Ms. Harris, the comments from the public, and the legal requirements of Arizona Revised Statutes 5540-360 to 40-360.13, upon motion duly made and seconded, the Committee voted 13 to 3, with the dissenting votes being cast by Nancy C. Wrona, Charles Kupcik and Dennis Sundie, to grant the Applicant the following Certificate of Environmental Compatibility:

Applicant Salt River Project Agricultural Improvement and Power District is hereby granted a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility for construction of a 230 kV transmission line from the existing Pinnacle Peak Receiving Station, west of Scottsdale Road and north of Pinnacle Peak Road, to the vicinity of the existing Brandow Receiving Station and then on to the existing Papago Buttes Receiving Station at Thomas Road and the Crosscut Canal near 64th Street.

The route exits the Pinnacle Peak Receiving Station to the

southeast paralleling the existing 230 kV transmission corridor and turns south across the Salt River Pima Maricopa Indian Community, still in the same existing transmission corridor, to the Salt River. It then follows the existing transmission corridor along the north side of the Salt River southwest, adjacent to the Brandow Receiving Station, to a point approximately 1/8 mile east of Mill Avenue. At that point, the route turns north to the Crosscut Canal and follows the canal to the Papago Buttes Receiving Station.

The line will be built on double circuit structures between Pinnacle Peak and the Brandow Receiving Station. These structures will duplicate the existing lattice towers from the Pinnacle Peak Receiving Station to the Salt River. Single pole steel structures will generally be built along the remaining portion of the route, but some lattice towers may be installed to duplicate existing structures. From Brandow to a point east of Mill Avenue, the line will be constructed as a single circuit. From where the line turns north, east of Mill Avenue, to the Papago Buttes Receiving Station, steel pole structures will be built to carry a single 230 kV circuit.

The existing section of 230 kV line currently built on lattice towers near Moeur Park in the vicinity of the intersection of Mill Avenue and Curry Road and passing west of the Arizona Children's Service Hospital will be relocated to a ravine approximately 1/8 mile east of Mill Avenue to parallel the new route. The line will be built on steel poles in this new alignment. This new alignment will rejoin the existing alignment at a point just south of the City of Tempe Water Treatment Plant. The existing twelve lattice towers between the Tempe Water Treatment Plant and McDowell Road will be replaced with steel poles.

This certificate is granted upon the condition that the Applicant will comply with all existing applicable air and water pollution control standards and regulations, and with all existing applicable ordinances, master plans and regulations of the State of Arizona, the County of Maricopa, the Cities of Phoenix, Scottsdale and Tempe and any other governmental entity having jurisdiction.
